
## Week of Service

Check out our <u>Citizen Archivist Dashboard</u> for new records to transcribe. You will find records related to Mediterranean Passports, which were certificates issued by the Secretary of State in an attempt to ensure safe passage of American vessels in areas threatened by Barbary pirates; slave manifests from the Port of New York; marriage licenses from the Office of Indian Affairs White Earth Agency; records from a wide range of civil rights issue in United States history, and much more! What will you learn and discover as you begin to transcribe?


Special thanks to all of our citizen archivists who are helping unlock history. Here are just a few examples of the great work being done this week:
