## Presidential Materials in the National Archives Catalog

Did you know that every U. S. President since Herbert Hoover has a Presidential Library, and that <u>these Libraries</u> are administered by the National Archives and Records Administration? Information about much of the archival material held at the Libraries can be found in the National Archives Catalog alongside records from government agencies. Archivists at the Libraries, just like archivists at other NARA locations across the country, are busy getting all

of their collections described in the Catalog. These Catalog descriptions contain details that help users decide whether a collection might be relevant to their research, such as what or whom the material is about, how much material there is, when the material was created, collected, and/or maintained, who created it, and what format(s) are included. As materials are digitized through the various digitization programs and projects happening at the Libraries they are making these digital objects available through the Catalog as well.

Collections at the Presidential Libraries, especially those at Libraries established prior to the Presidential Records Act of 1978, often have more in common with personal papers collections found in archival repositories outside of the government than with the federal agency records you can find in the Catalog. In addition to records that document the day-to-day work of each administration (materials created by the President and others who worked in the White House), Libraries also hold donated collections containing the personal and professional files of family members, friends, and other associates of the President. Sometimes the collections are surprising; for example, the John F. Kennedy Library holds the largest collection of Ernest Hemingway materials in the world (read about how the collection ended up there).

Branch of Alaskan Geology: <u>Alaskan Aerial Survey Expedition Photographs</u>, 1926-1979


Black and white aerial photographs of 10,000 square miles of southeast Alaska.

Surveys were taken by U.S. Navy personnel, airplanes, and equipment in cooperation with the Geological Survey.




## Mount Edgecumbe Boarding School: Yearbooks, 1947-1983
