Spotlight on Photographs Documenting the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC)

The Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) was established on April 5, 1933, when President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed Executive Order 6101. It was signed just one month into Roosevelt's presidency, making the CCC one of the earliest New Deal programs.

The program was by no means perfect and was met with some criticism. However, the CCC quickly proved to be a popular program, especially among those that benefited – specifically unmarried, unemployed men between the ages of 18 and 25 (that age range would later be expanded to 17 through 28), as well as their families. They earned \$30 a month, of which they were required to send \$25 home to their families. Throughout its nine year lifespan, an estimated 2 to 3 million young Americans participated in the Civilian Conservation Corps.

Records documenting the <u>Records of the Civilian Conservation Corps</u>, <u>1933-1953</u> can be found in <u>Record Group 35</u>. The organizational structure of the CCC, coupled with the fact that the CCC worked with various agencies, means that photographs of the organization's activities are not in a centralized location at the National Archives; CCC photographs can be found interfiled among textual records, at the FDR Presidential Library, and within the collection of the Still Picture Branch. 

How to Search for CCC Records



Civilian Conservation Corps and Still Picture Holdings

- Approximately 50 Still Picture series that include CCCrelated imagery.
- Images can be found in approximately 15 different record groups.
- Arrangement of records varies from series to series.
- Important to gather information prior to searching:
 - Company Number(s)
 - Camp/Project Number and Location(s)
 - Type of work completed
 - Names of federal and state agencies the CCC company worked with


